I was lucky enough to try out a set of these great trays. I've tried the "ice-cube tray" method (rolls eyes) and I can tell you that it's very messy, the food dries up even with plastic wrap and it's not easy to get out a few cubes you need. With other cube methods I've found that the lid pops open and you won't have any of these problems with the Qubies. The soft silicon (BPA free) lid stays on! It has a flat bottom so you won't get any spillage either and it's nice and compact so it doesn't take up room in your freezer.



I froze potato mash (our favourite) last night and was able to twist the tray (it separates the cubes) and pop out three cubes to feed my hungry 1 year old. It's so, so easy to use and easy to wash up as it's only two pieces.



After 45 (very long, leg tugging) seconds in the microwave, his breakfast was ready and he gobbled it up. It's so relieving to know there are quick no-nonsense plans for a busy mum who needs to feed their baby pronto.
