THESE funky upside-down ice cube trays. No more banging the tray on the bench or sink, trying to get the frozen contents out only to have them spill on the floor.

Qubies were created by Perth mum Alexandra Wardle, who became so frustrated with traditional ice containers that she hit the design studio.

She originally used Qubies as storage for home-cooked meals and breast milk for baby son Tyler. But, of course, there are much wider applications. for kitchen whizes: lemon juice, stock, passionfruit pulp, tomato paste, egg yolks . . . the list goes on. Instead of dividers being inside the ice tray, Qubies has reversed the design with dividers on the lid. Simply fill, snap on the lid and freeze and the contents are divided into seven 30ml portions.

Qubies are made of nonstick silicon and come in aqua or lime.
